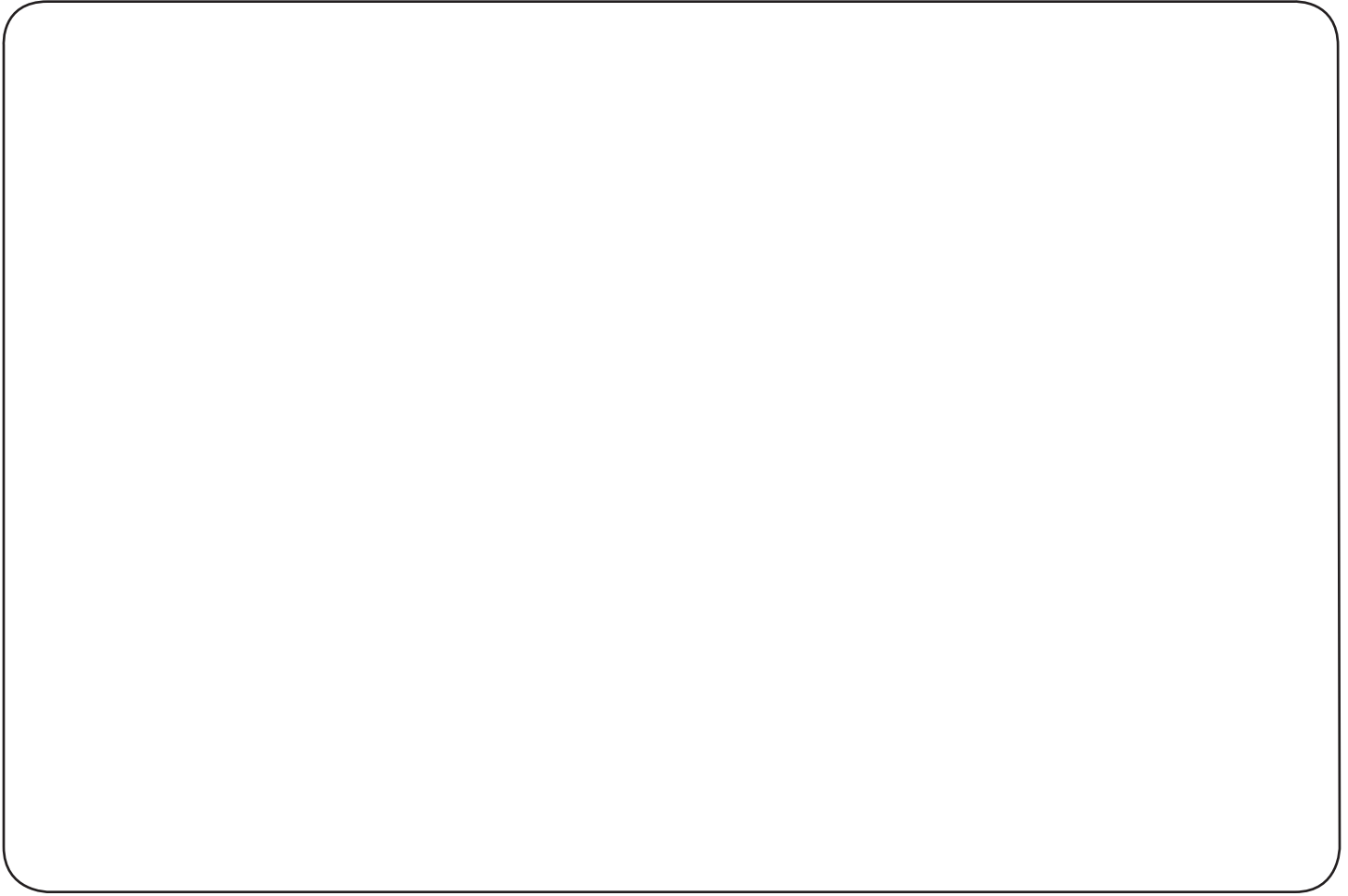

BRINE SHRIMP EGG CAPTURE BOOM REQUIREMENTS

Anyone placing brine shrimp egg capture booms on the Great Salt Lake shall comply with the following boating and wildlife rules:

R650-204-3 Hazards to Navigation

No person shall place any permanent or anchored objects on the waters of this state without written authorization by a federal agency operating within federal authority or by the division.

R657-52-16 Certificate of Registration (COR) Markers.

A certificate of registration (COR) marker shall consist of a piece of equipment, furnished by the harvesters, constructed in accordance with the following specifications:

- A six foot long piece of tubing with a weight at one end.
- This piece of tubing shall have a fluorescent orange ball that is a minimum of eighteen inches in diameter, mounted in the approximate center of the length of tubing. The fluorescent orange ball shall have the certificate of registration (COR) number, corresponding to the certificate of registration (COR) decal attached to the marker pursuant Subsection R657-52-16(2)(c), marked in two places with indelible black paint. The painted certificate of registration (COR) numbers shall be a minimum of twelve inches in height.
- Mounted above the orange ball towards the un-weighted end of the tubing shall be a decal issued by the division which denotes the certificate of registration (COR) in use and corresponding to the certificate of registration (COR) marker device.
- Mounted on the tubing between the orange ball and the un-weighted end of the tubing shall be an aluminum radar reflector that is a minimum of fifteen inches square.
- Mounted above the radar reflector shall be a three-inch wide band of silver reflective tape.
- Mounted on the un-weighted end of this tubing shall be an amber light that at night is visible for up to one-half mile and flashes 30 times per minute, minimum.

The certificate of registration (COR) marker must be displayed in a manner that is:

- visible in all directions at a distance of 500 yards; or
- displayed above the superstructure of any vessel that a certificate of registration is being used from.
- The amber light on a displayed marker device must be operating at all times between sunset and sunrise.

R657-52-17 Use of Booms.

- "The boom is marked with a certificate of registration (COR) marker as described in Subsections R657-52-16(2) and (3); and (iv) the certificate of registration marker is lighted as described in Subsections R657-52-16(2)(f) and (4)."

73-18-2(9) Definitions

"Division" means the Division of Outdoor Recreation.

No harvesting of shrimp or deploying of booms within 1/4 mile of the navigation buoys of the Great Salt Lake State Marina or Antelope Island Marina.

HAZARDS TO NAVIGATION AND WATERWAY MARKER REQUIREMENTS

Anyone placing possible hazards to navigation on the waters of this state shall comply with the following boating rules:

R650-204-1 Placement of Waterway Markers

No person shall place on or near the waters of this state any waterway marker, except a divers flag, without written authorization by a federal agency operating within federal authority or by the division.

R650-204-2 Hazards to Navigation

No person shall place any permanent or anchored objects on the waters of this state without written authorization by a federal agency operating within federal authority or by the division.

73-18-2(9) Definitions

“Division” means the Division Outdoor Recreation.

To comply with this requirement, the entity or individual placing the waterway markers or permanent/anchored objects must complete an “Application for Permission to Place Device on Boating Waters” form and return it to the Division for approval.

The Division will require the following:

1. All unattended objects will be visibly marked with the name of the entity’s or individual’s name. The letters shall be:
 - a. a contrasting color to the object; and
 - b. at least three inches in height with the letter width proportionate to the height.
2. Each permitted waterway hazard shall be marked with light(s) if placed overnight (see below for requirements).

Light Requirements

1. All lights must meet the U.S. Coast Guard requirements for marker lights
 - a. Informational buoy - white color flashing light (30 flashes per minute minimum) that is visible for up to one-half mile. The buoy shall be self righting and have a three inch silver reflective band around the top and the light must be at least 39 inches above the water.
 - b. Docks, cabling, pipeline, fishing nets, research devices, etc. - yellow color flashing light (30 flashes per minute minimum) that is visible for up to one-half mile. A three inch silver reflective band shall be located near the light to increase visibility of the object from all sides. If a buoy is used to mark the unattended object, the buoy shall be self righting and have a three inch silver reflective band around the top and the light must be at least 39 inches above the water.
2. The marker light shall be in operation from sunset to sunrise.
